Stanley' We have been mapping the story and thinking about the expanded noun phrases and adjectives in the text and coming up with some of our own examples of this. In maths year 1 are focusing on counting in stages of 2's,5's and 10's and year 2 are finishing off their work on multiplication.

Character:

Kingfishers have continued to look at the virtue of Service this week and have been thinking about #theworldwewant. We came up with the things we want in our world, how we want the world to look and how we might be inspired to serve and change things in our world for the better.

Swallows have been thinking about the changes they can make to create the world we want. They have also been thinking about their special gifts and how important it is to share them with everyone.

Little Otters learning:
