Academic Excellence

Little Otters: We are explorers and active learners ... This week we have been exploring different patterns in our indoor environment and outdoor we have used colours, size and numbers.

Kingfishers: This week we have continued to explore resourceful ways of measuring in our Maths, we are using vocabulary and concepts linked with capacity and volume. Perhaps you could look to see how much different containers hold at home? In our RE/English we have continued to explore why Easter is important to Christians. We have thought about all the signs of new life we see at this time of year and how the cross is a sign of new life for Christians.

Swallows: This week we have begun a new unit in maths on geometry. The children have been very resilient learners focusing on the vocabulary needed for the different terms involving shapes, angles and lines.

We have finished our non-chronological reports on the civil rights movements this week and began our new RE unit based around the Easter story. So far we have explored the events leading up to the crucifixion and the resurrection using drama to support our writing. We have started to unpick the incredible amount of forgiveness that Jesus showed people and the trust he had also.

Character Education

Little Otters: We are enjoying practicing our Easter service song. We are confident, passionate performers.

Kingfishers: This week we have started discovering the virtue 'Forgiveness'. We have made some great links with the Easter story and also created some art work to remind us about ways that we can show forgiveness to others. We continue to use the language of virtues all through the day in Kingfishers and it really helps us communicate our ideas and feelings, as well as make sense of different situations we deal with every day.



Swallows: Swallows have been exploring forgiveness as a new virtue this week. We have linked this to our studies in RE on Easter events in the Bible and also thought about why people seek forgiveness and how it feels to be forgiven. The children have been very reflective and are beginning to use this virtue in their friendship and playtimes! The children have shown good team work this week and cooperation when working in groups.

Community

Little Otters: We care for our world... We are still studying the changes in our tadpoles. We have been investigating what they eat and how to care for them but we are also planning for when they need to be released. We are having group discussions about their habitats and where they will be safe.

Kingfishers: This week Kingfishers have been #inspiringadventurers visiting Exmoor Zoo. They spent the morning looking for animals found in Uganda, cheetah, Guinea fowl, sititungas, black panther and lots of others. The afternoon saw us witness the feeding of the cheetahs and the African painted dogs followed by a hands-on session where the children were able to touch and feel a snake, spider and giant African snail. We can confirm that no children or animals were harmed or eaten on the trip. The zoo was a fabulous learning zone with lots of inspiring speakers and staff. The children were amazing and the staff were very complimentary about them.





Swallows: This week some children organised a fundraiser for Ukraine. We all dressed up in blue and yellow and donated money to support the people who have lost everything. The children were inspired to support and create change. We raised nearly £50!! And Mrs Sharpe has promised to match it, taking our total to £100! Well done Clinton!!



Digital and Innovation

Little Otters: We are creative and critical thinkers... Little Otters enjoyed being creative whilst making Mothers' Day cards, they could choose all the resources they needed. We also have been talking about the weather and how the weather helps our planet.

Kingfishers: In Wild Tribe this week Kingfishers have been thinking about ways that we can innovate ideas using natural materials. We have linked in our art and DT skills and thought of ways we can create things using sustainable materials which help our planet. We also linked in innovation with our science this week where we researched how people in Uganda grow and care for their plants.

Swallows: The children have finished their innovative DT moving toys projects with Mrs Clarke and this week they are evaluating them so hopefully they will arrive home in the next few days. We have also been continuing with our Jam boards individually and collaboratively.
