

Academic (Wisdom, Knowledge and Skills)

- As speakers, readers and writers we will explore the life of the Anglo-Saxon King Alfred the Great. We will use our persuasive writing skills to argue whether or not Alfred really was great. Year 3/4 will focus on the difference between the plural and possessive 's', prepositions, and develop a range of conjunctions for complex sentences. Year 5/6 will focus on passive voice and comparing the difference between active and passive, revise subject /object and develop a range of conjunctions, what they mean and how to use them.
- As religious and world view explorers we will look at the question, 'Why do Hindus want to be good?'. We will identify and explain Hindu beliefs, make clear connections between how they live and their beliefs, connect the four aims of belief with the life cycle and explain how and why their beliefs are important to them. We will learn about Dharma, Karma, Samsara and Moksha.
- As mathematicians we will finish our learning on geometry and move on to perimeter, area and time.
- As scientists we will explore materials. We will explore properties of materials, investigate thermal conductors and insulators, investigate materials that will dissolve, separate mixtures and explain the irreversible change of chemical reactions.
- As historians we will learn about the Anglo-Saxon settlers, why they came, who they were, how they lived and who their rulers are. Focusing on Alfred the Great and what he did for our country introducing the English language.
- As physically active learners we will discover the skills needed for athletics and tennis.
- As computer scientists we will explore the 3D world in TinkerCad and create some 3D images.
